

Grad Senate Elects Muller, Stack Officers

The Graduate Senate met last night for their annual election of new officers by that body. The results were that John A. Muller was elected as President; Barbara Stack, Vice-President; Karen Erickson, Treasurer, and Pat Brown, Secretary.

Nominations for President were Michael Curran and John Muller. Curran stressed in his nominating speech that the main job of the office would be organization of the Graduate Senate into an effective body representing the total graduate body.

Muller agreed that this organization of the Senate was important, however, he stressed that this organization should be coupled with an effort to develop the total graduate student body into a professional group capable of meeting the needs of each individual grad student in terms of professional development, financing his education and helping with problems the student may be experiencing with administration.

Muller has completed almost all the requirements for a PhD in English Literature and will receive the degree in June 1974.

In 1972 Muller was elected Vice-President of the Graduate Senate. He developed that position into a major channel of liason and rapport between the Graduate Senate, the undergraduate government, and the university government.

Muller is in favor of a de-centralized executive, a sharing of decision making, the advice and consent of the senate on all political appointments and support of departmental level graduate organization.
